

## Orofacial Pain—A Priority at LSUSD

In collaboration with other faculty members, Dean Henry Gremillion, DDS, MAGD, is in the process of developing resources for orofacial pain treatment and education at LSUSD. Dr. Gremillion came to LSUSD in 2008 with a vision to create a clinic where patients suffering from chronic facial and neck pain could receive quality care at an affordable price.

LSUSD will provide education in the treatment of orofacial pain for students and residents as well as practicing dentists worldwide. The educational component will include classroom instruction and clinical experience. Plans are underway to establish a masters program and a one-year fellowship for dentists interested in specializing in the field.

Another focus will be the fostering of collaboration between basic scientists and clinicians to research new and improved clinical treatments for temporomandibular disorders (TMD) and orofacial pain. Pain in the oral and craniofacial system has a fairly high prevalence and often, a devastating impact on the quality of life. According to some surveys, an estimated 22% of Americans older than 18 years of age commonly report pain in the orofacial region. The underlying causes of orofacial pain continue to evolve due to new research discoveries.

Prior to joining LSUSD as dean, Dr. Gremillion was the

Parker E. Mahan Endowed Professor of Orofacial Pain in the Department of Orthodontics at the University of Florida College of Dentistry. He also served for 17 years as the director of the UFCD Parker E. Mahan Facial Pain Center

and its fellowship program in craniomandibular dysfunction.

Dr. Gremillion has recruited to LSUSD a core group of fellow specialists: Dale Ehrlich, DDS, MS; Gary Klasser, DMD; and Christopher Spencer, DDS. Dr. Ehrlich serves as chair of the Department of Comprehensive Dentistry and Biomaterials. Drs. Klasser and Spencer are associate professors in the Department of Diagnostic

Sciences. All three have extensive education and experience in the treatment of orofacial pain.

A current focus is the Orofacial Pain Continuum, taught by Drs. Gremillion, Ehrlich, Klasser, and Spencer, and offered through LSU Health Continuing Dental Education. Each year-long course, which contains five interactive sessions, is designed for dentists and other healthcare professionals who want to improve their ability to evaluate, diagnose, manage, and refer patients with TMD, sleep disorders and other types of orofacial pain. Registration is now open for the fourth continuum, June 2, 2017 through May 12, 2018.
